### **FLOOD ALERT**

#### What it means

Flood is possible, be prepared

### What to do

- Be prepared to act on your flood plan
- Prepare a flood kit of important items
- Keep informed watch local news reports and/or listen to local radio stations



#### **FLOOD WARNING**

#### What it means

Flood is expected and immediate action is required

#### What to do

- Protect yourself and your family, help others
- Move family, pets and valuables to a safe place
- Keep a flood kit ready
- Turn off gas, electricity and water supplies if safe to do so
- Put flood protection equipment in place

# Items for your flood kit

Prepare a kit, in case you need to leave, which might include:

- Copies of your house insurance documents
- A torch with spare batteries
- A battery or wind-up radio
- · Warm, waterproof clothing and blankets
- First aid kit
- Bottled water and non-perishable foods
- If applicable, baby food and care items



#### SEVERE FLOOD WARNING

#### What it means

Severe flooding with a danger to life

#### What to do

- Stay in a safe place
- Be ready in case you need to leave your home
- Follow instructions from the emergency services
- Call 999 if you are in immediate danger

#### Remember

- Know who to contact and how
- Check with the local council if pets are allowed in evacuation centres
- Keep a list of important contacts to hand
- Check your insurance cover

#### Prepare your home

- Seal air bricks with plastic covers
- Sandbag around areas that may let in flood water

# Safe Refuge Areas

#### **Houses**

Move to the top floor.

#### **Flats**

Move to the floor above the water level.



## **Escape Routes**

- Please cooperate with the emergency services, they will tell you what to do if you need to leave your home.
- If the emergency services ask you to leave they will take you to an evacuation centre run by the local council.
- You are allowed to take pets, but they must be put into a secure carrier or box.
- In the event of a flood, you must concentrate on the safety of yourself and your family.
- You must act quickly and get everyone in your home to a place of safety.
